If we are heading away for a School Sports Competition we are representing Waiwera South School. Please make sure all students are wearing their sports uniform & school polar fleece + navy pants.


Do you need some budding young workers to help out??

If you think you have a suitable bit of land, and you would like to work in partnership with Waiwera South School over a period of time, let us know!




Colour Run Writing by the Juniors
