

Kia Ora Families and Community,

A massive well done to all of our students for their performance at Small Schools Cross Country on Monday. I know I have said it on Facebook and further on through the newsletter, but the attitude and behaviour of all of our children was outstanding! It makes us proud to call ourselves Waiwerians!

We have had a few events in the past few weeks that we have taken children to, and at everyone of them the children have been polite, engaged and enthusiastic. Well done kids, you are all awesome!

Last week the whole school went to SOHS to listen Brando Yelavich talk. Some of you may not know of Brando, he is an inspirational adventurer who has overcome some struggles to find his passion and drive for life - which is adventuring. Brando was the first person to circumnavigate New Zealand on foot, an adventure that took him 600 days. Brando spoke to us about goal setting, using your emotions (and showing emotion) and the importance of people in our lives. He had some very funny stories that he shared and I am sure that all of the children left with some interesting or insightful idea.

We had 6 senior students who were lucky enough to stay on and attend a writing workshop with Brando - they talked in more depth about goal setting and being realistic about achieving them - and also that it is ok to reset your goals if you find they are not quite right for you.

The year 5-6s had their New World Netball tournament last Thursday - they played brilliantly as a team - their skill level improved throughout the day and they ended the day 2nd overall. Top job Yr 5-6s. On Friday the yr 7-8s had their version of the tournament, again the children were fabulous and worked brilliantly as a team - a lot of fun was had by all, the team did not place but had a great day of teamwork.

We have a super fun event planned for after SOPSSA - because the children have all trained so hard and set themselves such good goals we thought we would top it off with a bit of fun - you guessed it A WHOLE SCHOOL COLOUR RUN!

School sores (aka Impetigo)

There have been a couple of cases of School Sores lately at school. Please be aware as this is a highly contagious skin infection. Some key points to be aware of...

Key points...

- 1. Impetigo is a very contagious skin infection. This means it easily spreads from one person to another.
- 2. Impetigo is found generally on the hands and face, especially around the nose and mouth. It can also affect other areas.
- 3. Children should see a doctor for assessment and treatment. Careful cleaning of the sores and the use of antiseptic or antibiotic cream may be advised. Sometimes oral antibiotics are prescribed.
- 4. Children should be kept away from school or daycare until the sores are healed, or as advised by your doctor.
