
Working Bee

JUNIOR ROOM


While learning about the human body the Junior Class has been looking at fingerprints and all the different patterns we have on our own fingerprints.

for all children and young people up to 18 years old $\text{on Sunday } 12^{\text{th}} \text{ December 2021}$

Registration is at the Balclutha Soccer Club from 9 am on the day,

or collect an early entry from the Balclutha Police Station, those entries must be delivered to the Police Station, or email to kathryn.bartlett@police.govt.nz by 4pm on Friday the 10th Dec.

The weigh in is between 1.00-2.30 pm with prize giving at 2.30pm at the Soccer Club. No fishing licence required for the day, and 40 rods available to loan from Fish and Game There are great prizes to be won along with some super spot prizes.



Children under 14 must be accompanied by an adult while fishing, and you must be entered to be eligible for prizes.

Due to working within Covid Level 2 restrictions, we have had to reformat our day slightly to ensure that the day still goes ahead. We won't be able to have our big sausage sizzle and prize giving due to the number restrictions.

You are still welcome to register on the day but will be required to scan in and wear a face mask if aged over 12 years.

If you require a fishing rod and a lesson, please come along and meet us at the Soccer Club and someone will be there to help you out.

When you bring your fish into the Soccer Club to be weighed you will be given a bag of treats, and your fish to take home.

You are welcome to come in and grab your bag of treats even if you don't have any luck catching a fish.

The prize winners for the fishing competition, and spot prizes will be notified and arrangements for prizes to be uplifted or delivered will be made.

This year we are allowing anyone to fish from their boats if they wish, this is totally the responsibility of the adult supervising that boating safety regulations are followed.
