Welcome back after a long weekend. We have a lot going on at school at present and are going to continue to be flat out for a few more weeks yet!

Last week the Middle Class spent 2 days down at Camp Columba in Pukerau, although the weather wasn't fabulous it sounds like they had an awesome time - with everybody giving everything a go. Miss Holden's Class had their Junior Day Out with a trip to watch a show in Dunedin and a swim at Moana Pool - there were some very tired children returning on Thursday afternoon!

Now that the 2019 camps are done and dusted, we thought now was as good a time as any to tell you of our plans for next year's camp. We are going to do things slightly differently next year, in that we have a booking at Bannockburn for the week of March 30 -April 3rd. 
