It is up to parents to get their own children to South Otago High School - they will need to be at the bottom field on Frances Street by 9.15am and picked up again at 2.15pm. Children are to wear their school sports tops, and blue or black shorts or leggings. They must also have warm clothes - trackies, school polar fleece/hoodie and a waterproof jacket, as well as a sunhat and suncream. Please apply suncream in the morning before you leave home - we will re-apply at lunch time too. The children will also need lunch and a big water bottle. There is **no stall** at Small Schools so the children need to have enough food and drink to last them all day.

We are still in need of helpers for long jump and to accompany children around their events. If you can help please let a staff member know.

As I write this we are waiting in anticipation for the promised rain (it's Tuesday morning) fingers crossed it does arrive and by the time you are reading this we have had steady rain over the last 24 hours. Our poor farms and gardens are crying out for rain!

Jennifer took out 3rd place at the School level competition and Niall won the spotprize. Congratulations everyone!




